## **Volunteer Opportunities**

The Club requires, from all members, a minimum of twelve (12) hours of volunteer time during the year. The main categories for volunteering include:

- 1) AAC sanctioned trials: Weekend trials with morning and/or afternoon shifts on the Saturday or Sunday; evening trials with a full shift. Each full shift will be 4-5 hours. Weekend trials require a 2-hour set-up on the preceding Friday afternoon; the evening trials a 2-hour mid-afternoon set-up. After each trial, there is also the short teardown activity. All trial volunteer commitments will be arranged through the Trial Volunteer Coordinator
- 2) Facilities: Maintenance of equipment, grounds and buildings throughout the year, including the “painting party” at the beginning of the season and the storage of equipment at the end of the season. Outstanding jobs will be listed in the ‘job-jar’.
- 3) Volunteer Committee: help is needed to organize, coordinate and assign volunteer duties.
- 4) Training: Instructors are needed at all levels, and sometimes assistants at lower levels.
- 5) Demos: The physical act of hauling equipment to the site and returning home again. Participation in the show itself does not count as volunteer time.
- 6) Social: A limited amount of opportunity including BBQ’s, Christmas party etc for the benefit of all.
- 7) K-9 Kup: This is self-supporting by the teams as part of the learning process for the dogs, handlers and ring helpers with ADSC-Agility providing the coordination. Members may be able to receive volunteer credit for some of the key positions (gate-keeper, scribe, timer) providing they are not a member of any K-9 Kup team).

### **Frequent Volunteer Reward Program**

The total amount of time done by you (or by a friend or family member in your name) counts. In recognition of outstanding contributions, eligible members will be offered the following: a) 50 hours or more, free membership for the following year; b) 40-49 hours, 75% reduction of fee; c) 30-39, 50% reduction of fee; d) 20-29, 25% reduction of fee. Of course, any member may choose to waive the offer and pay the usual membership fee.
